



Project Summary

Clinical Lecturer in Rheumatology in conjunction with Univeristy of Bath, RNHRD RUH Bath, funded partly by BIRD

Dr S Tansley recruited for the part award of £24000.00 each year for up to 4 years

The University of Bath in collaboration with the University of Bristol and the Severn Deanery have identified local funding to support an Academic Clinical Lecturer (ACL) post in Rheumatology to be taken up from 1st September 2018.

This programme will provide up to four years post-doctoral training for a rheumatology trainee seeking to consolidate their career in academic rheumatology and begin to establish themselves as an independent researcher. The length of the lectureship will depend on previous clinical training. The appointee will be expected to complete a CCT in Rheumatology within the post. The post is available either full time or part time.

The objectives of this clinical lectureship are to:

- provide the opportunity to develop a substantial and coherent programme of research
- consolidate clinical competence and experience in Rheumatology to complete clinical training
- prepare a high-quality application for an intermediate fellowship or clinician scientist award

The successful applicant will split their time 50:50 between clinical training in the Department of Rheumatology at the Royal National Hospital for Rheumatic Diseases as part of the Royal United Hospital, and academic work at the University of Bath, appointed at the appropriate point on the clinical lecturer scale. Within the sessions at the University, the main activity will be research although involvement in teaching will also be encouraged. Time will be divided into blocks of clinical or research work as most appropriate for the research the appointee plans to pursue

The post holder will be employed by the University of Bath, with an honorary clinical contract with The Royal United NHS Trust.
